What is mental health?

Mental health, as defined by the World Health Organization, is "a state of well-being in which every individual realizes his or her own potential, can cope with the normal stresses of life, can work productively and fruitfully, and is able to make a contribution to his or her community."

Behavioral Health Versus Mental Health - What's the Difference?

Behavioral health describes the connection between the health and well-being of the body and the mind.





Mental health, which is one area of behavioral health, can include a variety of factors, such as biology, psychological state, and habits.

What are behavioral health services and why are careers in this field important?


- Behavioral health services can extend to:

 - Psychiatric conditions





What are behavioral health services and why are careers in this field important? (cont.)

- We all experience different levels of mental health throughout our lives.
 - Depression is the leading cause of disability worldwide.
 - Less than 50% of U.S. adults with mental illness received treatment in 2018.



FACT

There are not enough mental health professionals to go around.

Over 44 million American adults (18.07%), have a mental health condition.

Pursuing a career in behavioral health can put you in a position to help others.



Peer providers, (e.g., peer support specialists, recovery coaches) are people who use their experience of recovery from mental health and/or substance use disorders to support others in recovery.

Community Health Worker

Frontline public health worker who is a trusted member of and/or has an unusually close understanding of the community served. This trusting relationship enables the Community Health Worker (CHW) to serve as a liaison/link/intermediary between health/social services and the community.

Autism Technician

Autism Technicians work in a fast-paced, dynamic, and often intense environment to provide Applied Behavior Analysis treatment to children and adults diagnosed with language, communication, behavioral and developmental disorders such as Autism Spectrum Disorder.





