Per The Medical Board of California Website:

Medical assistants are **unlicensed** individuals who perform non-invasive routine technical support services under the supervision of a licensed physician and surgeon, podiatrist, physician assistant, nurse practitioner, or nurse midwife in a medical office or clinic setting. The supervisor **must** be on the premises in order for the medical assistant to perform those non-invasive technical support services.

Medical assistants may obtain "certified" status through private agencies approved by the Medical Board of California.

A list of "Frequently Asked Questions" addressing the appropriate training, supervision, and scope of practice issues, is available to assist members of the public and profession to understand the role of the medical assistant within the health care system.
