




IEDR Annual Average Unemployment Rate, 2004-2019






Major Industry Groups, 5-year Job Growth, 2018-2023




Health Care Sub-Industries 159,460 jobs



Health Subsector Industry Job Counts, 2018-2023





The Inland Empire Desert Region will have nearly **75,000** annual middle-skill job openings over the next five years. Middle-skill jobs require more education than a high school diploma but less than a bachelor's degree. Your local community college is a great place to learn the skills needed to acquire a career that provides gainful employment opportunities and self-sustainable wages.

The top 100 middle-skill jobs earn \$15 per hour or more and account for 70% of all middle-skill job openings in the region.



Wages After Training


