Priority for this plan: Student safety

This is a two-step plan: Plan A for the current situation where the students stay in the clinical area and Plan B for if the students are dismissed from the clinical area.

Plan A: Students still in the clinical area	Plan B: Students removed from the clinical area
<p>Priority: Safety of students in the clinical area</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Minimize exposure right now.</li><li>2. Stay in the facilities until we are asked to leave.</li><li>3. Instructors evaluating patient assignments to decrease risk.</li><li>4. Reinforce the airborne rule- isolation policy.</li><li>5. Students need to self-report if they are showing symptoms. This needs to be done immediately. Clinical make up will need to be implemented.</li><li>6. VITAS will be on hold until next semester, since we are not sure how the virus is being handled in the community.</li><li>7. New admissions with respiratory symptomatology will be evaluated on a case by case basis.</li><li>8. Students who work in health care facilities who end up on or are quarantined will be worked with on a case by case basis.</li></ol>	<p>Priority: Continuity of program; completion of clinical hours</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Every semester will have two alternate assignments that can be used should students be removed from the clinical facilities.</li><li>2. Additional simulations will be offered that correspond with student learning objectives.</li><li>3. Other community activities will be considered including providing education to on-campus students about the Coronavirus, hand hygiene, prevention. Also, blood pressure screenings and safe sex education (the condom cart) may be employed.</li><li>4. Students who may end up self-quarantined for a period of time will be tested using secure remote technology.</li><li>5. Classes will continue to be held using online technology, including Canvas or Zoom.</li><li>6. Because this is a public health issue, students who are self-quarantined by public health will not have their grade docked for clinical time missed.</li></ol>
